The Concepts of Probable Cause and Qualified Immunity

- The 13 Illinois Use of Force Statutes
- Use of force in defense of person, dwelling, and property,
- Use of Force by aggressor.
- Peace officer's use of force in making an arrest.
- Prohibited use of force by a peace officer.
- Force likely to cause death or great bodily harm.
- Use of Force to prevent escape.
- investigation of officer-involved deaths.
- Mandatory drug/alcohol testing.
- Internal review of officer-involved shootings.
