

- Identify and discuss minimal versus reasonable force and policy/contextual implications
- Identify considerations regarding thorough, accurate and effective use of force reporting
- Instruct students in basic knowledge, nomenclature and selection of the revolver, pistol, and ammunition
- Instruct students in the proper loading, unloading and operation of the revolver and semi-automatic pistol
- Instruct students in basic handgun shooting fundamentals and marksmanship
- Identify and provide remedy to shooters who exhibit difficulty with basic marksmanship skills
- Identify and provide remedy to various weapon malfunctions
- Identify challenges and tactical considerations involving the use of firearms in low or no-light environments
- Effectively convey and incorporate the principles of adult learning and human factors into physical firearms skills instruction and student performance in the context of tactical law enforcement field use of the handgun
- Safely operate the police firing range as a range master
- Develop and safely and effectively deliver dynamic courses of live fire, incorporating proper police tactics
- Clearly understand and convey potential issues for firearms instructors regarding failure to train liabilities
- Instruct students in the proper handgun inspection and maintenance

Students will need the following equipment:

- Semi-automatic duty handgun (revolvers may be brought/used in conjunction with semi-auto)
- 3 magazines for duty weapon (3 minimum, more is better)
- Police duty belt, holster, and other related gear
- Tactical flashlight (MUST be suitable for tactical use)
- Eye and ear protection, ball cap
- Body armor
- Handgun cleaning kit
- 600 rounds factory-loaded handgun ammunition
- 10 or more dummy rounds
